
Bird Conservation 2.—S. A. Temple (Ed.). 1985. Madison, Wisconsin: University of Wisconsin Press, 190 pp. \$17.50 cloth, \$12.95 paper, ISBN 0-299-10220-3 cloth, ISBN 0-299-10224-6 paper.—The second volume in this series, published for the United States Section of the International Council for Bird Preservation, con-

cerns island birds. The contributions discuss primarily the status of land birds on island possessions of the United States. However, James Wiley's paper on bird conservation in the United States Caribbean includes a summary of seabirds on Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands. He also describes the status and importance of the remnant wetland habitat on Puerto Rico, Boqueron Refugio de Aves, which is now being managed by the Department of Natural Resources for water birds. Other wetlands of importance to waterbirds include the Humacao Lagoons, Tiburones Swamp, Torgugero Lagoons, and Cartegena Lagoon, the latter a 325 ha patch of a once vast wetland. Governmental interest in the acquisition and management of these sites needs to be encouraged.—**James A.
